STAGE 1 - REMAINING VIRTUAL

HOW CAN YOU MAXIMIZE AND PRIORITIZE ENGAGEMENT OVER VIEWS?

Easy win: schedule some time with a small group of students or a family to make quality connections.

WHAT IS A NEW DISCIPLESHIP PATHWAY YOU CAN IMPLEMENT IN THIS VIRTUAL ENVIRONMENT?

Easy win: This is the perfect time to set up your older students to disciple the younger ones. You may watch something truly special unfold in your ministry.

HOW CAN YOU SERVE FAMILIES MORE INTENTIONALLY?

HOW CAN YOU TRAIN, ENCOURAGE, AND PASTOR YOUR VOLUNTEER BASE?

This group of people may be impacted and hurting from COVID-19, as well. Without a doubt, they are stretched thin with work and responsibilities trying to serve in ministry.

STAGE 2 - PARTIAL RE-OPENING

HOW WILL YOU MINISTER TO STUDENTS WHO NEED OR CHOOSE TO CONTINUE STAYING HOME WHILE ALSO MINISTERING TO STUDENTS WHO GATHER IN PERSON?

Perhaps the most important question of the day. How do you make sure they aren't lost in the excitement of some returning? How can you make sure students who are not in the room still feel like they belong?

HOW CAN YOU MOBILIZE STUDENTS TO CONNECT WITH EACH OTHER FOR CARE AND SUPPORT?

WHAT WILL YOU DO IN THE FIRST ENVIRONMENT BACK TO CAPTURE THE MOMENT AS A CATALYST FOR MOVING FORWARD AS A MINISTRY?

Teaching, atmosphere, and volunteer leadership are all part of this question. If we come back and do the same exact thing we were doing the Sunday before quarantine, we are missing an opportunity.

Easy win: Connect personally with each volunteer to know their plan. Additionally, this provides an opportunity to pastor them as you discover potential struggles and needs.



PHASE 3 - TOTAL RE-OPENING

The truth remains: our ministries are only as healthy as the volunteer leaders that we've recruited, trained, and cared for.
